THE PROGRAM IN BRIEF

This two-week program enables students to learn, or further develop their knowledge of, both spoken (Mandarin) and written Chinese language.

At the conclusion of the intensive 30-hour program, participants will be able to:

- read and write 120, and identify around 150, common Chinese characters;
- use Chinese to conduct simple daily communications; and,
- gain familiarity with various aspects of Chinese traditional culture.

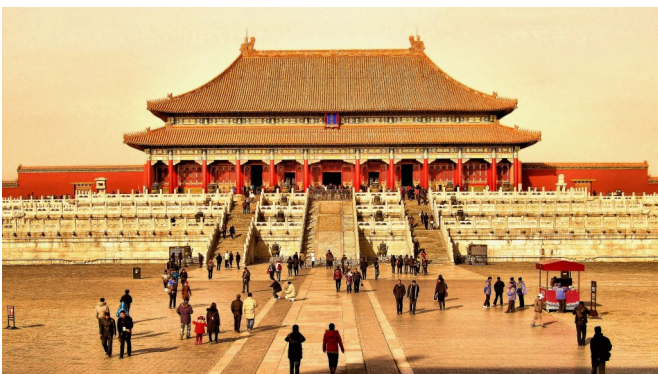

The program is intended for students and others who are already studying Chinese language, and those without prior experience. All levels of current Chinese language skills are accommodated and a pre-existing knowledge of Chinese language is unnecessary.

The program is run by the NanJing Polytechnic Institute in January and July each year with the January program designed to suit the Australian and New Zealand summer academic breaks.

WHO WILL BENEFIT?

- Students at senior secondary school level (typically years 11 and 12) and at tertiary level (TAFE/ Polytechnic and Universities) studying Mandarin and/or Asian Studies.
- Teachers of Chinese (typically in Primary and Secondary schools), wishing to extend their skills and abilities.
- People whose work requires them to contact or interact with Chinese organisations or companies, or their representatives.

BASIC PROGRAM COSTS

The cultural tour to Beijing and Xian has been developed by *Insider Journeys* especially for program participants. Quality hotels, with breakfast, are included.

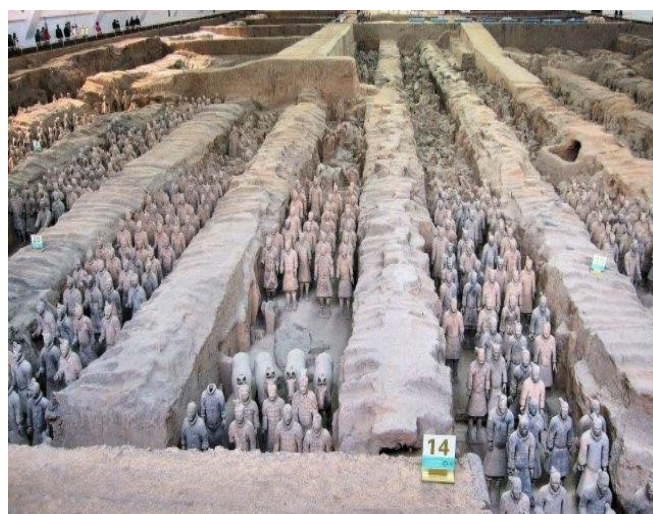
